- Licensed as LCSW, LCPC or LMSW.
- Three to five years of clinical expertise working with youth and families. Residential and/or school setting preferred.
- Proven treatment planning experience in MaineCare Sections 97 and 65 preferred.
- Experience with Electronic Health Records (EHR)
- Satisfactory reference and background checks. Must have a valid driver's license.

- Oversees all Section 97 and Section 65 Atrezzo procedures.
- Participates in educational and clinical team meetings providing input regarding assessment, service planning, and behavioral interventions.
- Participate in Therapeutic Crisis Intervention training.
- Document daily clinical work in EHR (AWARDS) as set forth by organizational policies and procedures and state regulatory agencies.
- Participates in and provides required training to meet regulatory, licensing and accreditation and provides in-service training to Good Will Hinckley staff.
