Woolly Mammoth Tusk

This fossil is part of the tusk of a **woolly mammoth** (*Mammuthus primigenius*). The mammoth is an extinct species of mammoth that lived during the Pleistocene until its extinction in the Holocene epoch. It was one of the last in a line of mammoth species.

Preservation Funding

A National Endowment for the Humanities Preservation Grant for Smaller Institutions will provide funding for the museum collections preservation. It will present a conservation workshop in spring 2024 and provide much needed safe storage materials for historic Good Will-Hinckley archival documents and objects. The grant will include funds for needed shelving and acid free boxes similar to those pictured below. Helpful volunteers will work to safely store the collections.
